Charlie, the Fire Station manager has been in touch with the PC to ask if we would be willing to support an event he is organising for the village, they don't have any funding for the room hire, which would be £30.60.

I was wondering how we could go about reserving the village hall one evening in November for a community event I'm trying to build.

The concept is very simple, open door workshop with input on basic first aid and effective CPR.

We will have dummies, training bandages etc. emergency services always try and be with patients as quick as possible, however it's often that immediate action from a bystander that can make the most impact.

Is this something you can help support?'

Charlie also came into the office to talk to us about the event, is looking at doing three drop in sessions to provide basic life saving skills.

There are funds in the Community Events budget (£33) that could be moved into H&W budget to allow us to support the event. Is this something you would be in agreement with?
